GOAL: To fully fund the Impact Aid Program.

- As of November, 2010, school districts are still waiting on the Department of Education to pay five years in back Impact Aid payments.
- Impact Aid is currently funded at 60% of need, as defined in law.
- Impact Aid is the only education program not forward funded. Therefore, delays in funding decisions affect the current school year.
- Over the past 9 years, due to inflation, the Basic Support Program has lost one-third of its buying power.
- Appropriations have not kept up with the local contribution rate (LCR) and student count, so the LOT percentage is slipping. If the Impact Aid appropriation is frozen in FY'11 the LOT could drop below 100% for the first time since 1997.
